1 WHEREAS, on September 28, 2009, this matter came before the Court for hearing on  
2 Plaintiffs' Unopposed Motion to Distribute the Cy Pres Fund;

3 WHEREAS, on March 12, 2008, this Court granted final approval of the \$96 million  
4 Settlement Agreement entered into by Class Plaintiffs and Defendants U.S. Smokeless Tobacco  
5 Company, *et al.* (collectively "UST");

6 WHEREAS, at the final approval hearing, this Court overruled all objections to the  
7 Settlement Agreement and found that the plan of allocation (which provides that \$5 million of the  
8 Settlement Fund be distributed *cy pres* on behalf of class members who infrequently purchased  
9 smokeless tobacco, and that any funds remaining in the Settlement Fund after payment of claims,  
10 attorneys' fees and costs, taxes, settlement administration costs, and any class plaintiff incentive  
11 awards, will also be distributed *cy pres* (the "Cy Pres Fund")) is fair, reasonable, and adequate;

12 WHEREAS, at the final approval hearing, the Court also directed the parties to meet and  
13 confer to provide the Court a joint recommendation on a plan of distribution for the Cy Pres Fund  
14 and a description of the work performed by each organization;

15 WHEREAS, the parties have consulted and agree with each other, have provided such joint  
16 recommendation on a plan for distribution of the Cy Pres Fund, have reviewed applications  
17 submitted by the *cy pres* candidates, and have provided the Court with a description of the work  
18 performed by each candidate;

19 The Court having considered all papers filed and proceedings herein,

20 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Plaintiffs' Motion to Distribute the Cy Pres Fund is  
21 GRANTED, and this Court hereby approves of the *cy pres* plan of allocation, attached hereto as  
22 Exhibit A, and finds that it is fair, reasonable and adequate to the class.

23 IT IS SO ORDERED.
